Corridor Redevelopment

By doing so, we can attract profitable businesses, increase the tax base, and improve mobility and livability for our residents.

Code Enforcement as a Redevelopment Tool

Every community struggles with vacant, overgrown, and dilapidated properties. The first line of attack in removing these conditions of slum and blight is code enforcement. In addition, attendees will see examples of the results achieved and how code enforcement has resulted in new private investment.
