What Are Brownfields?

What Are Brownfields?

■ Brownfield site means real property, the expansion, redevelopment or reuse of which may be complicated by actual or perceived environmental contamination. 376.79(3) F.A.C.



What Are Brownfields?

■ Brownfield area means a contiguous area of one or more brownfield sites, some of which may not be contaminated, and which has been designated by a local government by resolution. Such areas may include all or portions of community redevelopment areas, enterprise zones, empowerment zones, other such designated economically deprive communities and areas, and Environmental Protection Agency-designated brownfield pilot projects. 376.79(4) F.A.C.

Brownfields Redevelopment can...

- Increase property values and tax revenues
- Decrease urban sprawl and inner city blight
- Reduce or eliminate threats to human health and the environment
- Promote effective use of available infrastructure and resources







Florida's Brownfields Redevelopment Program



Florida's Brownfields Program Structure

- Incentive based program
- Brownfield Area
 - Local government designation
 - Makes tools of Florida program available to properties in the area
- Brownfield Site Rehabilitiation Agreement (BSRA)
 - Voluntary cleanup agreement
 - Provides initial eligibility for Voluntary Cleanup Tax Credit

Key Terms:

- PRFBSR = Person Responsible for Brownfield Site Rehabilitation
- BSRA = Brownfields Site Rehabilitation Agreement
- SRCO = Site Rehabilitation Completion Order

Florida Brownfields Program Incentives

Florida Brownfields Program Incentives

- Brownfield Area
 - ◆ Job bonus refund, up to \$2,500 per job
 - Loan guaranty program
 - Limited sales tax refund on building materials
- Brownfield Site Rehabilitiation Agreement
 - Eligible for incentives above, plus...
 - Liability protection
 - Voluntary cleanup tax credits
 - Site rehabilitation costs
 - Transferable



Voluntary Cleanup Tax Credits

| Tax Credit Type | Application Frequency | Maximum Credit for Costs Incurred after 06/30/06 | |
|----------------------------------|-----------------------|---|-----------|
| Site Rehabilitation | Annually | 50% | \$500,000 |
| No Further Action (i.e., SRCO) | Once | 25% | \$500,000 |
| Affordable Housing | Once | 25% | \$500,000 |
| Health Care Facility or Provider | Once | 25% | \$500,000 |
| Solid Waste | Once | 50% | \$500,000 |

In Addition...



SRP Grant

- State and Tribal Response Grant
 - EPA funding
 - Administered by FDEP
- Independent of the Florida Brownfields Program
- Grant of services, performed by FDEP contractors
 - Up to \$200,000 for assessment tasks
 - Up to \$200,000 for remediation tasks (source removal)
- Eligibility considerations
 - Meet federal definition of brownfield
 - Applicant did not cause or contribute to contamination
 - No viable responsible party
 - Project provides public benefit
 - Applicant has willingness and ability to complete project


EPA's Brownfields Program Emphasis

Eligible Contaminants






Excluded Sites:

- •Facilities listed/proposed on the National Priorities List;
- ·Facilities subject to CERCLA order or decree; and
- •Facilities that are subject to the control of the federal government

Authorized Federal Brownfields Funding



Annual National Competition; approximately \$79M awarded each year

Brownfields Assessment Grants

| Community-Wide | Site-Specific | Coalition |
|--|---|---|
| Up to \$200,000 for hazardous substances and \$200,000 for petroleum | Up to \$200,000 for hazardous substances or petroleum | Up to \$1,000,000 for hazardous substances and/or petroleum |
| No waiver of funding limit | May request a waiver for up to \$350,000 | No waiver of funding limit |
| Maximum combined amount \$400,000 | Maximum combined amount \$350,000 | Maximum combined amount \$1,000,000 |

>3 year performance period

>No cost share

Example eligible activities:

- >Phase I/II Assessment
- >Cleanup / Reuse Plans
- >Community and stakeholder outreach
- >Inventory brownfields

Brownfields Cleanup Grants

Site-Specific

Up to \$200,000 for hazardous substances and/or petroleum

Applicant must own site at time of proposal

Applicant can <u>not be potentially liable</u> <u>for contamination</u> under CERCLA

Non-profit organizations are eligible to apply

Applicants may apply for funding for up to 3 sites

- >3 year performance period
- >20% cost share

Example eligible activities:

- >Cleanup
- >Cleanup Planning
- **▶ Confirmatory sampling ONLY**

Brownfields Revolving Loan Fund Grants

Community-Wide

Up to \$1,000,000 per eligible entity

Funding to capitalize a revolving loan fund and provide subgrants for cleanup activities

Applicant and borrower can <u>not be</u> <u>potentially liable for contamination</u> under CERCLA

- >5 year performance period
- >20% cost share

Example eligible activities:

- >Cleanup
- >Loan Program Implementation
- > Confirmatory sampling ONLY

Job Training Grants

- Provides Environmental Remediation Training; certifications
 - ◆ 40hr HAZWOPER
 - ◆ OSHA
 - Confined Space entry
 - ◆ Lead, Mold, Asbestos
- Targets Under- and Un-Employed
- Partner with Local Educational Institution
- 2 year performance period



Targeted Brownfields Assessments

- Grant of services
 - **◆ EPA Contractors**
 - ◆ Services Phase I & II Assessments
 - ◆ Requests accepted year-round
 - ◆ Funding is limited

Success Stories

Residence Inn, Tallahassee


- Historical use
 - ◆ Warehouse
 - Petroleum storage
- Contaminants
 - Arsenic, petroleum, dioxin
- Brownfield activity
 - ◆ TBA grant for dioxin removal
 - BSRA for remaining rehabilitation
- Community Benefits
 - Previous property value \$588,166
 - Current property value \$10,139,737
 - ◆ 32-full time and 9 part time jobs
 - Key redevelopment for the Gaines Street revitalization effort






Lowes - Fern Park

- Historical Use
 - ♦ Kmart oil change facility
- Contaminants
 - Petroleum soil and groundwater impacts
- Status
 - USTs/ Hydraulic Lifts removed
 - Soil remediated
 - ◆ SRCO issued 3/2008
 - ◆ Lowes opened 2007
 - \$225,000 for job creation



Centro Asturiano, Tampa



- Historical use:
 - Hospital
 - ◆ Abandoned in early 1990's
- Contaminants/Concerns
 - Incinerated hospital waste
 - Petroleum contamination
 - ◆ Biohazards
 - Vagrants and vandalism
- Status
 - SRCO achieved
 - Redevelopment project
 - Affordable housing
 - Assisted living

Voluntary Cleanup Tax Credits

- Credits on Florida corporate income tax
- May be transferred once
- \$2 million annual cap
 - If exhausted, first priority in next year's allocation
- Credits awarded for eligible work
 - Site rehabilitation
 - Solid waste removal, transport and disposal
- Bonus credits awarded for site rehabilitation only
 - ◆ SRCO
 - Affordable housing
