Finally, the Arbor Day Foundation recently declared Plantation a **Tree City**, marking the 40th time in the City's 71-year history it has attained that status.

The City celebrated the occasion at the February 7, 2024 Council meeting by raising the Tree City flag outside City Hall to accompany the United States, Florida, and City flags.



Development Update

As you travel around the City of Plantation, you can appreciate the abundance of growth we are experiencing, which means added revenue to the City's tax rolls, varied and exciting places to live, outstanding employment opportunities, a thriving economy, and more opportunities to enjoy Plantation's enviable quality of life.

Thanks to significant investment by the City, the **Plantation Gateway District**, and the Plantation Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA), Plantation Gateway along State Road 7/441 has become one of South Florida's most desirable development locations. As you drive along the corridor, you truly know when you are in Plantation by the signature banners, thoughtful landscaping, and an unparallelled dedication to quality development.

• PIXL condominium is currently under construction with the first two phases to be complete by the end of 2024. • A 4,300 sf multi-tenant retail center is under construction at 201 South State Road 7.

 HCA Plantation General Hospital received approval to erect a new free-standing emergency room facing State Road 7 at Hospital Drive/NW 4 Street.

 Plans for Arkham Apartments have been approved and are currently in permitting. Arkham will be a beautiful new development consisting of eight one-bedroom apartments located on Peters Road.

• The City is working with a local developer to finalize plans for a 14-unit townhome complex in the same neighborhood as Arkham Apartments. It will be the first fee-simple, workforce housing development in Plantation.

 Plans are underway for Publix to become one of the anchor stores at the West Broward Shopping Center, located on the northeast corner of Broward and 441.
 Redevelopment of the center is planned as part of the construction.

• Plans for Zee Car Wash along North State Road 7 have been approved, and include a self-serve drive through carwash and vacuum stations, and upstairs office space.

ELSEWHERE IN PLANTATION

The City's central business district, **Plantation Midtown**, bordered on the north and south by Cleary Boulevard and I-595, and on the east and west by Pine Island and University, is becoming a true town center, with unprecedented office, residential, restaurant, and retail options available.

• The Chevron station at Peters and University, and Plantation Square, located at the southwest corner of University and Sunrise are scheduled to get beautiful, updated façades this year.

• The University of Miami Sylvester Cancer Center is expanding, and has begun construction on a second 15,000 sf building in Plantation Crossroads office park, near SW 10 Street.

 Plantation Midtown Square (the former American Express property) is also under construction at the corner of Cleary and Pine Island, with 480 apartments, 86 townhomes, and a retail and restaurant component. 240 apartment units and 58 townhomes have been completed.

 Construction is underway on the Wawa gas and convenience store at Pine Island and Broward Boulevard. It joins Starbucks, Chim Authentic Thai and Sushi, and Smoosh Cookies Plantation.

• Plans for a Home2Suites by Hilton have been approved, and will be constructed between Peters Road and SW 13 Place, just south of First Watch and the Enson Asian market. Home2Suites is a nationally recognized all-suite extended stay hotel featuring a contemporary guest room design.

FINALLY ...

There is a great deal of interest in **Plantation Technology Park** and the adjacent corridor, which runs along Sunrise to University Drive.

 Companies joining Magic Leap, Motorola Solutions, Chewy, Kenig Aerospace, Goodwin Technology, and eBuilder include an array of retail and restaurant options.

• Construction on Sunrise Logistics and Plantation Self Storage is complete.

• Chick-Fil-A has recently been approved, and will be joining other popular restaurant choices located in Plantation Pointe (Sunrise and University) as well.

Annual free chlorination event

The City of Plantation will be temporarily switching to free chlorination in its drinking water system beginning at 8:00 AM Sunday, August 25 and ending at 8:00 AM Sunday, September 8.

Free chlorination is a regularly scheduled preventive maintenance procedure for water systems using combined chlorination (chloromines) for disinfection. The City expects the free chlorination period to be a seamless transition to our customers, however some may notice a slight change in the taste or smell of their tap water. In addition, some may see fire hydrants with flowing water in their neighborhood as a normal part of this process. Residents who are on kidney dialysis or those who have other medical conditions should contact their health care providers for more information about increasing chlorine levels in their drinking water during this time.

At all times during this process the water produced by the City of Plantation will continue to meet local, State, and Federal standards for clean water and will remain safe for drinking, bathing, cooking, and all other purposes. The City of Plantation maintains the highest standards and is committed to delivering clean, high quality drinking water to our customers.

Park East water main replacement project update

Phases C and D of our Water Main Replacement Projects in Breezeswept Park have both kicked off in June. MarcDan (Phase C) and ENCO (Phase D) employees, as well as our own Utilities Inspectors, will be working within the right of ways up through our contractual completion date in the 2nd guarter of 2025. Becoming a City vendor

The Procurement and Financial Services departments maintain a vendor list for goods and services procured by the City of Plantation. If you wish to participate, please complete the Vendor Application, which can be found in the Procurement Department's webpages at Plantation.org. You will be asked to provide a current W-9 form. The information entered is stored directly within the City's registered vendor database. In order to maintain registered vendor status, the Vendor Application must be completed every calendar year.

Additionally, when you visit the Procurement Department's webpages, you can search for registered vendors and search and respond to bid/proposal solicitations. There is also a podcast hosted by Director Charles Spencer outlining the procurement process and how to do business with the City.

Finally, the City of Plantation has completely transitioned to electronic bidding for formal and informal solicitation(s) that exceed \$35,000. The City is no longer accepting paper responses of any kind to procurement solicitation. However, the City still requires original (with raised stamp) bid and public construction bonds. This move reflects a paradigm shift in the City's approach to the procurement process and a significant reduction in the need for paper. All responses will be received electronically via the Demand Star website.

Gateway policing update

Gateway Officers actively patrol the District and regularly engage with individuals to address issues. We have observed a decrease in both call volume and arrests since the first quarter. Since May 1, 2024, there have been a total of 3,483 calls logged. These include 43 arrests, 21 field contacts (officers proactively working with citizens on issues), 176 moving violations, 25 parking violations, and 50 criminal activity calls.

We remain actively engaged with the community, particularly in interactions with suspicious individuals, which are comprehensively documented through field contacts. To tackle the ongoing homelessness issue, the Police Department has added two full-time homeless outreach officers to our existing homeless outreach program. Gateway officers are also now trained in bike patrol, drone operation, and

homeless outreach.

Plantation Gateway Advisory Board

Plantation Gateway was established in 1988 as a Safe Neighborhood Improvement District for the State Road 7 corridor. It is generally located in eastern Plantation, along State Road 7/441 and Peters Road. The City completed a Master Plan that supported and enabled the City to establish as a special taxing district and utilize a maximum of two mills ad valorem tax on real property within the District. The City pursued this strategy in order to obtain additional State and local financial resources to address public safety, and set the stage for the future redevelopment of State Road 7.

The Gateway Advisory Board is composed of seven members appointed by the Mayor and Plantation City Council. It was established to represent property owners and the business community within the District, and to provide input to City Council and staff on how to allocate public funds generated within District. The Board also provides input on development projects within the District.

The Board meets every other month on Wednesdays at 10:00 AM in the Development Services Building, 401 NW 70 Terrace.

Using local vendors LOCAL BUSINESS PREFERENCE ORDINANCE

A balanced and stable economy is more readily achievable when the community, government, and local businesses work together. This has been the ongoing mission of the City of Plantation. As a means to assist the businesses in Plantation, the City adopted a Local Preference Procurement Ordinance in February 2010.

The Local Business Preference Procurement Ordinance enables local vendors to more readily offer goods and services to the City of Plantation. In short, if a local business is within five percent of the low bid, the City will give the local qualified business the opportunity to meet the price of the low bid. This will open the door for more local businesses to become vendors, while still retaining the lowest possible costs to our residents for City-related purchases. It is a winning situation for the business, the City, and our community.

To become a potential City vendor a business must have a local street address, a City business tax receipt license for at least six months, and be registered with the City of Plantation Procurement department. To register, they can go to the City of Plantation's website at Plantation.org and click on "Become a City vendor" on the home page.
